

California Democratic Party Executive Board Releases Positions on State Propositions on the November Ballot

SACRAMENTO, CA - Today, the California Democratic Party (CDP) Executive Board released their positions on twelve State propositions on the ballot in November. The following propositions were **SUPPORT**, **OPPOSE**, or **NEUTRAL** by the Executive Board:

- Prop 14 Borrowing for STEM Cell Research: SUPPORT
- Prop 15 Schools and Communities First: SUPPORT*
- Prop 16 Repeals Proposition 209, ending the ban on affirmative action: **SUPPORT**
- Prop 17 Free the Vote, grants the right to vote to people on parole: SUPPORT
- Prop 18 Allows 17 year olds to vote, if they turn 18 by the general election: SUPPORT
- Prop 19 Property Tax Breaks and Wildfire Fund: SUPPORT
- Prop 20 Tougher on parole, property crimes: OPPOSE*
- Prop 21 Rent Control: SUPPORT
- Prop 22 Exempts Uber & Lyft from providing drivers the benefits they deserve. Drivers rights over Uber/Lyft profit: OPPOSE
- Prop 23 Regulates dialysis clinics: **SUPPORT**
- Prop 24 Stronger consumer privacy laws: NEUTRAL
- Prop 25 End Cash Bail: SUPPORT*

The California Democratic Party's Executive Board meeting is held four times per year, the Executive Board gathers to vote and discuss CDP business, endorse ballot measures and support candidates.
